

MODDUS has been on the minds of Project Catalyst growers in the Hebert following a workshop held on the 30th of March. The workshop was facilitated by the team at HCPSL, prompted by conversations with several growers who had used the product successfully over the past 12 months and were considering its wider application across farm.

Over the course of the workshop growers discussed how crop ripeners work to increase CCS, how varieties are affected, and the importance of timing their application. In preparation, the team at HCPSL also met with Herbert growers from across the district currently using MODDUS. Growers participating in the recorded one-on-one interviews shared some valuable insights for how crop ripeners have worked for them. The team hopes to use, produce, and share this material in the coming months to assist growers wanting to apply product over the course of the season. PC UPDATE from Ross

2022 is already proving to be as fluid and challenging as previous years, with all the changes we've faced these challenges can only make us more resilient.

The 10 innovation trials that ran up to March 2022 have been completed and the final report to the GBRF has been submitted.

The 2021 Coca-Cola practice change adoption program has been completed and reported to WWF-Australia.

We can now confirm that funding from the Coca-Cola Foundation is in place to to continue our practice change program into 2022. A limited number of places are available for new growers in the Burdekin and Wet Tropics to join Project Catalyst's practice change pathway. Perhaps you could invite a neighbour.

The GBRF verification visit last month in the Lower Herbert went well and the GBRF spoke highly of our progress when we were with them in the field.
